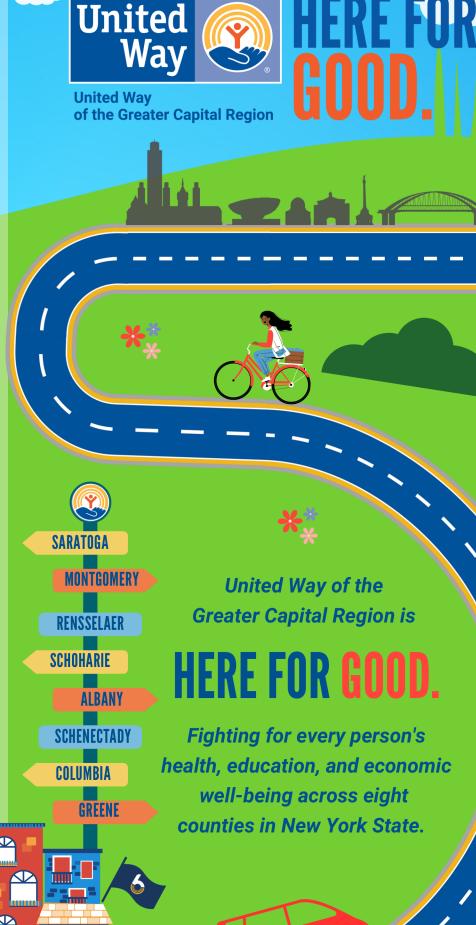

INVEST IN SYSTEMS CHANGE

UWGCR intentionally looks to support smaller organizations and advance equity by investing \$390,000 in emerging and BIPOC-led nonprofits through our Changemakers Fund and Luminosity Collaborative.

CONNECT COMMUNITIES TO RESOURCES

Fielded 10,000 calls at the 211 call center, connecting community members to vital services like food, shelter, health care, and mental health counseling.

PROMOTE FINANCIAL LITERACY & ENTREPRENEURSHIP

UWGCR and four local nonprofit partners engaged 105 kids in Danny Dollar Academy, a program for grade-school children to improve their financial literacy and spark their entrepreneurial spirit.
