Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed

ALICE families earn too much to qualify for public assistance, **BUT NOT ENOUGH TO MAKE ENDS MEET.**

They are healthcare workers, teachers, retail staff, and service providers—essential to our community, yet forced to make impossible choices between rent and food, medicine and childcare.

For some historically marginalized communities—particularly communities of color, women, and senior citizens, systemic barriers put financial security even further out of reach.
